Project SEARCH

Fifth Third Bank's Project SEARCH is a **HIGH SCHOOL TRANSITION TO WORK PROGRAM** that provides employment and education opportunities to individuals with cognitive and physical disabilities. Fifth Third Bank focuses on providing opportunities for individuals with disabilities to gain marketable and transferable skills.

Why Project SEARCH?



Project SEARCH is a oneyear, high school transition program that provides training and education that may lead to employment for individuals with disabilities.

Project SEARCH serves as an alternative for students in their last year of high school. Three elective high school credits can be earned for successful completion of the Project SEARCH program.

The cornerstone of Project SEARCH is total immersion in a large business. Five days a week, students report to the host business, learn employability skills in the classroom and job skills while participating in a variety of internships/experiences.

Certified special education teachers and job coaches work with both the students and the business staff. Students end their day by reflection, problem solving, planning and journaling their key learnings.

The ultimate goal upon program completion and graduation is to utilize their internship skills for gainful employment.

Why Fifth Third Bank Project SEARCH?

- -Three 10-week rotations with a focus on transferable skills (data entry, computer applications, customer service, phone skills, mail sorting, loan processing, credit card processing and support, etc.)
