HPS Kindergarten Belief Statements

- Kindergarten provides the first opportunity to develop family partnerships with the school.
- Kindergarten teachers create a warm, nurturing environment that will foster high self-esteem, confidence, and a sense of classroom community.

HPS Kindergarten Options All day/every day kindergarten will be offered in all elementary buildings A limited number of all day/alternate day prekindergarten sections will be offered in the following buildings: Alward Bauer Forest Grove Jamestown and South students will be bussed to Forest Grove, Georgetown and Park students will be bussed to Bauer.

Benefits of All Day/ Every Day Kindergarten

Social/Emotional Benefits:

- Less stressed environment
- More age-appropriate pacing for kindergarten students
- Increased time for small group and independent learning
- More consistency in daily scheduling
- Stronger teacher/student/family relationships

Academic Benefits:

- Enhanced teacher knowledge of students' strengths and needs
- More time for quality in-depth instruction
- Enhanced readiness for 1st grade
- Increased achievement on assessments
- Decreased need for remediation

Reading Workshap (integrated science/ social studies)	Word work, read sloud, Zoo-Phonics, guided reading, shared reading, practice/independent reading	75 minutes
Break/snack	Morning Break	15 minutes
Writing Workshop	Lucy Calkins, morning message, interactive writing	45 minutes
Handwriting	Handwriting Without Tears	15 minutes
Lunch/Recess		40 minutes
Math	Colendar, Math Expressions, practice/centers, hands-on explorations	50 minutes
Recess	8	20 minutes
Specials	Art, Gym, or Music	50 minutes
Purposeful Play	Imaginative play that promotes higher level thinking, creativity, and problem solving	40 minutes

Placement Information

Parents are being asked to determine their placement preference on the registration form.

- All kindergarten placement requests will be honored.
- PreK placement requests will be honored based on section availability. Preference will be given to children with birth dates between September 1 December 1.
- Parents will be notified of placement decisions by May 31, 2013.

Screening Information

- Parents who remain unsure of placement preference can request a screening appointment with Mrs. Ripley. We need your name, email and phone #. Mrs. Reagan will be in touch to schedule this with you.
- The Brigance screener is administered by kindergarten staff.
 The screening process takes approximately 30 minutes.
- Screening results will be used as an additional piece of data to help with placement determination.

Busing Details

Read the Transportation Policy handout.

- Complete daycare form (if necessary) and return to bus garage as soon as possible.
- Bus garage will send a postcard to you in mid-August informing you of stop location and time.
- Bus stop time: Arrive 5 minutes before scheduled stop time.
- Bus stop location: 1/8 1/4 mile from home. Buses do not go down cul-de-sacs or dead-end roads.
- Name tag: Wear for first 2-4 weeks of school
- Emergency plan: House key? Neighbor?
- Patience please: It takes bus drivers, students, and parents a few weeks to become accustomed to bus schedules, routes, and routines.

Lunch Details

Read the ABC's of the lunch program handout.

Lunch is \$2/day and milk is only .50/day.

- Lunch includes an entrée (2 choices daily), milk, and food bar (lettuce, carrots, canned fruit, and fresh fruit).
- Students take as much as they can eat from the food barbut no seconds on entrée or milk.
- Hudsonville participates in the National School Lunch Program: Supports those who are eligible for reduced priced lunches. Information supplied by mail in late summer.
